

Ask questions, work collaboratively and share our learning



House Team Colour System

The House Team Colour System in the Junior School is designed to build community, connection, and school spirit among staff and students.

Each student and staff member is sorted into one of four House Teams: Red, Yellow, Green and Blue. Throughout the school year, House Teams participate in a wide variety of activities - ranging from friendly competitions and themed spirit days to collaborative challenges and service projects. These events are designed not only to be fun and engaging, but also to develop important skills such as teamwork, leadership, resilience, and empathy.

Points are awarded to House Teams based on participation, effort, sportsmanship, and achievement across all aspects of school life. The system encourages a healthy sense of competition while celebrating cooperation, kindness, and community values. At the end of the year, the team with the most points is celebrated at the Closing Celebrations, where the winning team is awarded with the House Team Cup. It is always an exciting moment!

A special leadership role within the House system is held by our Grade 5 House Team Captains. New captains are selected and initiated at the beginning of each term, giving multiple students the opportunity to experience leadership throughout the year. Captains play an active role in helping to plan and lead House activities, support their peers during events, and promote a positive, inclusive atmosphere within their teams.

The House Team Colour System is a cherished tradition within our Junior School community!

Parent Resources

Bussing

Starting in Kindergarten, students are able to take the bus to school. Aberdeen Hall services the West Kelowna, Kelowna, Lake Country and Vernon areas with six bus routes on a daily basis.

Bus seats are secured for the entire school year and reserved on a first come, first served basis. Bus registration is sent out to all families in June of each year to reserve a spot for the following school year.

Uniforms

The school uniform is standardized to provide consistency of dress and a community within the school. Students must adhere to the dress requirements, which offer some latitude of choice. An image of excellence and quality is paramount at all times. To that end, we are asking parents to assist us by ensuring their child is always neatly presented.

Most uniform items are purchased through the school's uniform shop. It is important that students wear the uniform in its official style and parents endorse and support the uniform policy.

Formal dress "Number One" uniform is required on Mondays - our school assembly day - and for all official school functions and outings. Notice will be given when the Number One uniform is required on days other than Monday.

The daily school uniform ("Number Two") is worn Tuesday - Friday.

Hot Lunch

Our Hot Lunch Program provides nutritious, freshly prepared meals made in-house by our dedicated kitchen team. Offered five days a week, the program is designed to support the diverse dietary needs of our students by including vegetarian, vegan, and gluten-free options daily.
